

The SSIO United Kingdom embarked on **2 National initiatives** this year, adopting various communities in Sri Lanka as well as supporting SSIO Nepal in the construction of a new School - Sri Sathya Sai School Pokhara in particular, fund a Girl's hostel in Nepal.

On 16th June 2019 thanks to the generosity of devotees in United Kingdom the SSIO of Sri Lanka inaugurated a "Deep Well Project" at Sri Vallipuram (Eastern Region). Previously, 86 families had to walk long distances to obtain water often having to resort to drinking contaminated water from polluted lakes. Thanks to the devotees of UK this project will now benefit over 500 villagers (See Below).



Nepal

The financially underprivileged girls of rural parts of Nepal are vulnerable to human trafficking. Young and orphan girls face greater risk. To contribute to this fight against human trafficking and address this social menace albeit to a small extent, the Sathya Sai International Organisation Nepal has started a Children's Orphanage and a Sri Sathya Sai School at Pokhara.





The construction of the school building commenced on 25th March 2018 - Ram Navami Day. Out of the two hostels, the boys Hostel has been sponsored by SSIO Indonesia which is already under construction and the girl's hostel has been sponsored by SSIO United Kingdom. To date we have sent £30,000 to start the work.

Sri Lanka Projects - Further proposals

- 1. x3 New Water Projects (Deep Wells) providing free and clean water to 3 villages. Each Deep well construction costs approx. £1,000 each depending on the size of the bore well
- 2. x4 make shift halls to conduct open air school classes: £500 each
- 3. x10 sewing machines (£150 each) to help rehabilitate women
- 4. x300 eye cataract Ops there is currently a 3,000+ strong waiting list. Cost of lens is £30 per lens.

Nepal Girls Hostel Project

The girl's hostel which is being sponsored by SSIO United Kingdom is already under construction. To date UK has sent £30,000 but we still have a shortfall of a further £30,000 for the project.



FROM I TO WE TO HE




"We can be successful leaders, only if we are disciplined followers, who do not issue command, to others, but rather set an example of service in our actions." (SSS 12:11, 16 October 1974)

Let me begin by taking you on a journey, a journey which inspired change, a journey which showed me the ideals of how to be a true Bhaktha (devotee) of the Lord. I was blessed with the great fortune of being born into His fold. While growing up, throughout my education, my career and my personal life, I have always tried to ensure that He is at the centre of my life through everything I do. As I became a young adult and went off to university, I realised that adhering to the spiritual path can be somewhat difficult when you are encapsulated by a whirlwind of change and a society that does not share the same principles as you. What you consider to be 'righteous', another may not. This I believe, is a make or break for every young adult starting their journey into adulthood. After working for a year and experiencing the corporate world, I was introduced to the Sathya Sai International Leadership Programme (SSILP), by fellow young adults within my region, which changed my life in so many ways. The SSILP is made up of six online modules, followed by three residential modules which take place in the hallowed grounds of the Sri Sathya Sai Institute of Higher Learning and a graduation ceremony, which takes place in Sai Kulwant Hall, both in Puttaparthi. This beautiful journey began with a religious study of His literature followed by an online facilitation and workshop by our talented brothers and sisters on the SSILP committee. This was beautifully done as every word of His was studied, discussed, experienced and internalised by every young adult on the course.

Prior to making my travel arrangements to attend the residential modules in Puttaparthi, I was at a point in my life where I was not sure which direction I was headed. I was searching for answers about who I was and the purpose of this birth. Little did I know that all will be revealed when I arrived in Puttaparthi in July 2019. I spent four beautiful days immersed in His love and His message and understanding exactly what my purpose is. My purpose is to devote every second of my life to serving the Lord through my thoughts, words and deeds. My purpose is to be a flute through which the melodies of His divine breath pass through. My purpose is to not only know His message, but my purpose is to BE is message through my actions and my conduct. I learnt that through service to the Lord, we can transform ourselves and subsequently transform humanity. We need to inspire people by being living examples of HIS message and allowing the world to experience HIM through our actions. The content of the course is so appropriate and practical for every young adult, whether you are starting off your journey as a young adult, or whether you are at the end of your young adult journey.

Many of us know how difficult it can be to listen to pertinent speakers who speak on high philosophy and constant integrated awareness. It is a term we use, yet do not fully understand. However, this course has provided practical ways to ensure that we are constantly remembering the name of the Lord. One such example, is integrating Swami into our professional and personal lives. One of the issues we find as young adults, is that it is difficult to remember Swami, especially if we are working or busy in our day to day lives. We were taught to find one aspect in our lives, whether it is writing notes, or speaking, to inculcate Swami into. I have always had a habit of drawing love hearts and stars on all my notes. So now, every time I begin a new document, I always draw a heart and I tell Swami that this is my offering to YOU, please accept it and guide me so that I may complete this task as an offering to you. Since coming back, I began this practice, along with my spiritual sadhana and I have really felt Swami's presence



so strongly in my life. In everything I do, I feel a certain sense of peace which I have not felt before. I have taken just one step, I have made just one change, and HE has certainly taken one hundred steps towards me. That is the compassion and the love that He has for all of us. He asks us for nothing but gives us everything. Hence, it is now time we give our hearts and dedicate our lives to Him because, Swami, without you, we are nothing. You are the very essence of our existence. Every day, I try to be a better person and every day, I fail a little less because of your Swami, I fail a little less because of your loving hand, guiding me and guarding me so that I do not falter.

To all the young adults who have not yet participated in this course, I would humbly request every young adult to do this. The skills you learn, the literature you study, the people you meet and the transformation that you receive is priceless. My own transformation since returning from Puttaparthi has been one of greater discipline and ensuring that I keep Swami as the focus of my life and surrender everything to Him. You will learn how to be a human being, not only that, but how to be a living example of His message. I pray that with His grace, we can be instruments so that His message is resonating in every cell, bellowing in every corner of the world and uniting us as one orchestra in His divine mission.



National Eashwaramma Day 2019 From a Service Team Perspective

With Swami's grace, after many weeks of planning and coordination the Regional Service Coordinators and volunteers from different parts of the country came together for the hugely loved National Easwaramma Day celebrations for which over 650 people attended.

At the main venue, the stage, the alters, the exhibitions set up started on Friday evening.



On Saturday for some of the Service team the day started at 6.00am with the cooking team at a separate venue, where all the masala was gathered and prepared. There were separate volunteering teams for preparing, cooking, washing up and cleaning the kitchen facility so it can be handed back in a suitable condition. We thank the dedication of these volunteers who are remote from the venue, do not see any of the programme but ensure that delicious food is provided for all.







At the main venue, volunteers arrived at 7.15am, first task was to put the kettle on for the volunteers and for the devotees that were due to arrive. Somebody bought the fruit, somebody got the biscuits, somebody made the tasty pawa and along with the toast and hot drinks it was all lovingly laid out for the devotees. Breakfast was ready. The



volunteers were lovingly, enthusiastically all ready for the devotees as they trickled in from 8.30am. Then a coach load came and another and it got very busy. While breakfast was going on in the downstairs dinning hall, upstairs many volunteers set scene to ensure Swami's Altar was decorated beautifully, the hall setup, the P.A. ready and the stage was set for the programme.

At 10.30am the programme commenced with prayers and bhajans followed by introduction by our National President, Shitubhai.

Whilst downstairs, the dinning hall was being rearranged and cleaned up in preparation for lunch.





The tables were set, teams were formed with the food serving team, drinks serving team, the cleaning team, ushers team, washing team, back ground support team. How beautiful and loving the members of these team were. Willing to sacrifice their valuable time, willing to do anything, cooperating and operating with joy and smiles.

The transportation team left the venue at 10.00 to collect the food from the external kitchen, thermal containers were filled at the kitchen to ensure the food remained hot and arrived back at the venue at 11.45. In the meantime the rice was cooked at the venue, all food was laid out at two serving stations just before the arrival of the SSE children and their gurus and chaperons at 12.40 followed by the adults at 1.25pm

It got very busy, we estimated that over 600 plus people were served lunch from 12.40pm to 2.30pm and Swami took care of everything. Everyone looked so HAPPY.

The National Service team of UK are a dedicated and fun loving team, even our National UK President and his National Council took time out to help support the volunteers and join in the fun.

When it came to 3pm it was time for the children's tea break. About 10 volunteers came together to serve drinks, cupcakes and biscuits to the children. There was one table set up for all drinks and another with a mixture of cakes and biscuits. All children started queuing up with big smiles on their faces as well as the volunteers. It was a quick turn round as the children had only 15 minutes for their tea break before they had to go back to the main hall for the remainder of the programme. All volunteer served with joy and happiness which brought big smiles to the children. A group of 8 volunteers from 4 different regions made the cupcakes and cake pops for the children and for the takeaway bags. They were all baked on Friday taking about 3 hours to do and volunteers had a lot of happiness and smiles when baking and decorating them.

Finally as the programme finished and most of the devotees left to go home, we hope having enjoyed all aspects of the day and fully energised.



The remainder of volunteers started the dismantling, the packing up, the loading into cars and vans and the final clean up. With Swamis grace and with the number of dedicated volunteers the task this time was completed within one hour. All left the venue somewhat tired but satisfied.



We began by learning what Swami told us in a Discourse given on 14 January 2000 and published in the Sanathana Sarathi of March 2000;



God has taken 3 pledges

- 1. I will incarnate age after age for the firm establishment of Dharma
- 2. I will take care of those who constantly contemplate on Me
- 3. I will grant liberation to those who surrender to Me completely

and we should take 3 vows:

- 1. You will firmly believe in the existence of GOD
- 2. You will experience GOD
- You will become one with GOD

Swami says: Make every effort to fulfil these vows.

The 25 Shlokas which were covered on the day focused on the above message from Swami.

One by one, we joined in to recite each shloka led by Sisters Hema and Hina. This was followed by wonderful explanations by Sister Gowri on the meaning with beautiful stories which everyone could relate to. They were all based on Divine Discourses and writings by Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba. The Universal message of the Gita was





immensely beneficial to everyone present, not just the SSE teachers. We finished with an activity on the 3 Gunas. Everyone had a great time participating in this activity.

Region 8 (Scotland) SSE TEACHER TRAINING Bhagavad Gita & Bhaja Govindam







Region 8: Regional Eashwaramma Day Celebrations




